



Eucalyptus

Behind the Design

A smart, stylish solution for outdoor furniture, eucalyptus is a durable, time-tested material that reveals a natural patina over time. When exposed to the elements, eucalyptus develops an attractive silvery-grey hue, which speaks to the material's organic nature and does not affect its integrity. Hairline cracking and joint expansion are to be expected in all eucalyptus furniture. Aging timelines are dependent upon weather variables, climate and exposure.

Care Instructions

- Address spills immediately by wiping with a soft, dry cloth.
- Clean with warm soapy water, then dry with a soft, clean cloth.
- Avoid the use of harsh cleaners and abrasives.
- Avoid letting water stand on the surface of all eucalyptus furniture.
- Once furniture is clean and fully dry, protect with a well-ventilated cover during inclement weather and when not in use.
- For natural eucalyptus finishes, no additional care is required; however, a furniture technician can be consulted if reviving natural color is desired.
- On fully finished eucalyptus, wear or peeling is to be expected as the piece transitions into its weathered state and is not a defect. For finished eucalyptus, gently clean with a soft, natural bristle brush in the direction of the grain to remove finish that has started to peel away. This process will expose the raw wood, thus allowing it to begin to silver and blend back into the finish in 1-3 months.
